## Outline of the Messages for the Full-time Training in the Spring Term of 2023

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# GENERAL SUBJECT: THE CRUCIAL POINTS OF THE TRUTH IN PAUL'S EPISTLES

Message Five

### In Adam and in Christ the Divine Transfer from Adam into Christ

Scripture Reading: Rom. 5:12-21; 6:3-4; 1 Cor. 15:22, 45, 47; Gal. 3:27

- I. If we want to thoroughly know and accurately experience God's way of salvation, we must see that in God's eyes there are only two men in the universe—Adam and Christ—Rom. 5:14-15:
  - A. Adam is the first man, "the first man, Adam"—1 Cor. 15:45a:
    - 1. "The first man is out of the earth, earthy"—v. 47a.
    - 2. Out of the earth denotes the origin of the first man, Adam, and earthy, his nature.
    - 3. In God's eyes Adam and his descendants are one man.
  - B. Christ is the second man, the last Adam—v. 45b:
    - 1. According to God's view, the only man after Adam is Christ because there was only one man before Christ; thus, Adam is the first man, and Christ is the second man—v. 47b.
    - 2. Christ is not only the second man but is also the last Adam—v. 45b.
  - C. God's point of view is that every person in the world is either in Adam or in Christ—Rom. 5:14:
    - 1. Adam was the head of the old collective man (mankind); whatever he did and whatever happened to him is participated in by all mankind—v. 14.
    - 2. In this respect Adam is a type of Christ, who is the Head of the new corporate man, the church; whatever He did and whatever happened to Him is participated in by all the members of His Body, the church—Eph. 2:15-16; 1:22-23.
- II. In Adam we were born sinners, we were constituted sinners, and we inherited sin and death—Rom. 5:12, 15, 17, 19:
  - A. The first thing that we received in Adam was sin; through Adam sin has come to everyone—v. 12:
    - 1. We are not sinful because we have committed sins; we were constituted sinners in Adam—v. 19.
    - 2. Because of the disobedience of Adam, we have sin, and we have been constituted as sinners.
  - B. Since we all are sinners in Adam, we also deserve to be condemned because we share in Adam's condemnation—v. 18:
    - 1. Adam's sinning was our sinning because we were in him.
    - 2. As we obtained sin in Adam, we also inherited condemnation in Adam; being in Adam causes us to partake of condemnation—v. 18.
  - C. In Adam we first inherit sin, then condemnation, and finally death—1 Cor. 15:22:
    - 1. Where there is sin, there is condemnation, and where there is condemnation, there must be death—Rom. 6:23a.
    - 2. Our death in Adam has several aspects:
      - a. We became dead in our spirit because of sin in our flesh—Eph. 2:1, 5; Col. 2:13.

- b. Condemnation involves the death of our body, in which our body will lose its life and return to dust—Gen. 2:7; 3:17-19.
- c. Condemnation results in the death of the soul, in which the soul is tormented in Hades—Luke 16:22-25.
- d. Another aspect of condemnation is the second death, in which the spirit, soul, and body of those who do not believe are cast into the lake of fire to suffer; this is the final death and the eternal death—Rev. 20:15; 21:8.
- 3. In Adam we have these three terrible things—sin, condemnation, and death.

#### III. As believers in Christ, we have been transferred from Adam into Christ—Rom. 5:12-21:

- A. We are regenerated in Christ in resurrection; in this rebirth the divine transfer takes place and transfers us out of Adam into Christ—1 Pet. 1:3.
- B. John 3:16 speaks of believing "into Him" (Christ):
  - 1. Our believing causes us to enter into Christ—v. 15.
  - 2. When we believed into the Lord, our believing brought us into Christ so that we might enter into Him and become a person in Him—v. 16; 1 Cor. 1:30.
- C. We were born in the sphere of Adam, but through our baptism we have been transferred into the sphere of Christ—Gal. 3:27:
  - 1. To believe and be baptized are two parts of one step for our entering into the Lord—Mark 16:16.
  - 2. To believe and be baptized is a complete step that brings us into Christ, transferring us out of Adam into Christ so that we may be a person in Christ—Rom. 6:3-4.
- D. Of God we are in Christ Jesus—1 Cor. 1:30:
  - 1. Our responsibility is to believe and be baptized to enter into Christ.
  - 2. As far as the Spirit and life are concerned, it is of God that we are in Christ Jesus—v. 30.

#### IV. When we are transferred into Christ, we possess the innumerable riches in Christ:

- A. The first thing that Christ brings to us is righteousness; the obedience of Christ constitutes us righteous so that we may become righteous persons—Rom. 5:18-19.
- B. In Christ we are judicially redeemed, forgiven, justified, and reconciled to God—Eph. 1:7; Rom. 3:24; 5:10a.
- C. Christ's "one righteous act" of dying on the cross resulted in "justification of life"; justification is for life—v. 18:
  - 1. Through justification we come up to the standard of God's righteousness so that now He can impart His life to us.
  - 2. Justification changes our outward position; life changes our inward condition—v. 18.
- D. In Christ we are organically regenerated to be the many sons of God, the many brothers of Christ, for the constitution of the church, the Body of Christ—1 Pet. 1:3; Rom. 8:14, 19; 12:5; Eph. 1:22-23.
- E. In Christ we obtain not only the three items of righteousness, justification, and life but also every spiritual blessing in the heavenlies—v. 3.
- F. In Christ we are delivered out of the evil kingdom of Satan, that is, the authority of darkness—Acts 26:18; Col. 1:13a.
- G. In Christ we are freed from the vanity of the old creation—Rom. 8:20-23.
- H. "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old things have passed away; behold, they have become new"—2 Cor. 5:17:
  - 1. We have become a new creation in Christ; the old things in Adam have passed away, and they have become new in Christ.
  - 2. This is a result of being transferred from Adam into Christ.
